Since we've been back to bowls it is pleasing to see so many out on the greens practicing – or perhaps it is just a desire for more fresh air. Whatever the reason there has been a visual concentration of members returning to the basics and practicing the draw bowl which is a good idea after a long break, and may well have helped the standard of bowls in the singles championships which include some exceptional heads and close finishes.

As usual, we are reminded to 'practice with a purpose'. Don't allow your practice to become boring or tedious and make sure you are fit to practice by doing some simple stretching and warm up exercises. Reset your game and then expand your abilities by using specific drills to increase your repertoire of shots. You will be able to introduce your newfound skills to your social game by playing the shot called by even the most demanding skip.

If you are looking for copies of drills or just need some ideas, ask at the bowls office, or speak to one of the coaches.

Regular coaching sessions for potential members and new bowlers is held every Friday morning at 11.00 am with six regular attendees during July. If you know of anyone wanting to give bowls a go, bring them along and introduce them to the group. The coaching is free, and we have recently purchased a range of new coaching bowls. New bowlers and those returning to the game are always welcome to join in.



Junior Bowlers



The Junior Bowling Group is also back, but to a new time and day. The Junior Bowlers are now practicing on Saturday mornings from 9.30 am and will also be able to practice on Tuesday evenings when daylight saving returns. The group has five regular bowlers but is always looking for more – are there anymore friends, siblings, grandchildren, nieces, or nephews out there?

Congratulations to Luke Burton who has been selected in the Zone Junior Representative side to play in November. Although Luke did not come back with any trophies he is also to be commended for his standard of play during the recent Junior Championships.

Most of our Junior Bowlers are new to the sport but are developing well and we can expect a larger contingent from Terrigal competing next year.

Schools


Because of the Coronavirus interruption and restrictions, the primary schools 'Let's Play Bowls' program has been cancelled for this year.

Coronavirus and Bowls

The return to bowls from COVID restrictions is proving more difficult and frustrating than first thought. The truth is, it is not over but we are doing our best to operate within the limitations imposed by the Public Health Orders.

We initially returned to controlled and supervised roll ups, moved on to social bowls and then the resumption of championships for both men's and ladies' sections.

The programs for the remainder of the year have been agreed and have been posted to the notice board for your convenience. However, you will see several days and events listed as yet to be advised and some require consultation with other clubs.

The ongoing coronavirus restrictions have meant that decisions on some events have been deferred. Although the restrictions are no longer affecting our allowed numbers on the greens, the entry restrictions, the limited numbers and the bookings/seating arrangements permitted in the club do prevent some events from taking place.

Looking further ahead, the decision to run the men's pennants in July 2021 may be reviewed. It is possible they don't like playing in the snow at Monaro or Parkes – more info when we know.
