Unfortunately, training can become tedious and simply rolling up by yourself or with a friend is often not improving your game or specific skills.

A roll up allows you to repeat the same faults and mistakes over and over again.

You need to practice with a purpose.

First you need to Identify the problem or the area of your game which needs improvement. You might need to speak with a coach or your skip to get some advice and then prioritize your efforts.

Using specific drills implies you must have a disciplined approach to improve your game.

For example, amongst very familiar club members we are used to a certain amount of 'sledging' or perhaps commenting on the occasional wick or 'riding' an opponent's bowl. All in good fun on a social day amongst mates.

In bowls we have the Laws of the Sport, the Conditions of Play and a third collection of requirements referred to as the 'etiquette'.

Arguably, the term 'etiquette' is out of place in the 21st century, sounds 'old fashioned' and detracts from the efforts to attract young people into our sport. Perhaps the powers to be should consider replacing the term with 'sportsmanship' because it is all about 'respect' and being a good sport. Respect for the game, the team, the opponents, the officials etc. and recognizing ability. We are determined players, but we must be gracious winners and good losers.

Bad behavior and language are now included in the conditions of play across all States as a result of a Bowls Australia Policy and can result in the application of instantaneous penalties and can potentially be a game decider.

Also, before participating in Pennants and Championships, take the time to read the requirements pertaining to movement between the mat and head end of the rink. A copy is on the notice board.
