Pennants is over but for those bowlers that seek to improve there is a personal drive, a desire to practice and train. Afterall, there are several championships to play, mid-week pennants, club challenges and tournaments.

Practice can and should be fun. If you want to be good at something you must enjoy what you are doing. Social bowls is fun because you play with mates and club members – so why not practice and train with a mate. Who knows, you might even keep each other honest by taking an objective point of view about your capabilities and which skills you need to improve.

While we are staying at home, we might take the time to clean out the bowls bag and polish our bowls ready for a return. There are also several drills to research on Youtube in preparation for the practical stage and there are many videos of champions in action to keep the mind focused on bowls.

When we return, ask one of our coaches for details of drills for specific skills or arrange a one-on-one or group session. Our team of coaches now includes coaches with qualifications or experience to assist junior, new and aspiring bowlers, wheelchair bowlers, bowlers with impaired vision and bowlers with limited mobility problems. Position of Players

Where should you stand or where are you allowed to stand? Are questions frequently debated by bowlers. This is what it states in the *Laws of the Sport of Lawn Bowls*.

Section 1.3 POSSESSION OF THE RINK

12 Position of Players

12.1 In relation to the rink of play

12.1.1 Players at the mat-end of the rink who are not delivering a bowl must stand at least 1 metre behind the mat.

12.1.2 Players at the head-end of the rink and who are not controlling play must stand:

12.1.2.1 behind the jack if they are members of the team which is in possession of the rink;

12.1.2.2 behind the jack and away from the head if they are members of the team which is not in possession of the rink;

12.1.2.3 on the surrounds of the green if the jack is in the ditch; or

12.1.2.4 well clear of the head if it is not possible to stand on the surrounds.

12.1.3 As soon as a bowl is delivered, a player who is controlling play from a position that is either level with or in front of the jack, must take their position as described in law 12.1.2.

12.2 In relation to a neighbouring rink

12.2.1 A Player must not go into a neighbouring rink where play is in progress.

12.2.2 A Player must not go into or walk along a neighbouring rink, even if it is not being used, while an opponent is about to deliver or is actually delivering a bowl.

12.2.3 If the rink of play is an outside rink a Player must not go into or walk along the section of green that lies between the outside side boundary of the rink and the side ditch while an opponent is about to deliver or is actually delivering a bowl.





VETERANS AND SUPER VETERANS DAY

Unfortunately, due to the covid lockdown the Zone 15 Veteran and Super Veteran Day to be hosted at Terrigal in July has been postponed to a date in the October/November timeframe.

The Zone organisers said this does mean that the day will be held together with Veteran's Days for Southern and Northern Clubs and at a time when most of our veteran bowlers will have completed their covid vaccinations.

UNIFICATION UPDATE

The vote for unification of men's and women's State bowls organizations went ahead as outlined in our last edition of *Dolphin Tales* with an overwhelming YES vote to support the unification. We now receive information and circulars originating from the new joint organization.

Since unification they have clarified eligibility to compete in State (Association) events and determined that members may take up membership at multiple clubs but that only one club can be the declared club for the purposes of recognition at State level and for participating in Association events. This is not a change for male bowlers but it does mean that female bowlers can no longer be declared bowlers at two clubs (one to play women's championships and one to play men's).

During the lead-up to the vote it was explained that Zones/Districts and competitions would be reviewed. Once that is complete and communicated, the way ahead will become clearer.

The concern of many of our members was related to social bowls and whether our Tuesdays and Thursdays would continue as gender specific days. BowlsNSW advise that although open gender events are being introduced, gender specific bowls events will also continue. Hence, there is no intent to change from the current format for our Tuesday and Thursday bowls and Sunday Morning bowls for the foreseeable future. Our mixed days and twilight bowls are run as open gender days, so there is also no change to their format.

Championships are run in accordance with the current State Conditions of Play and will only change when and if those Conditions of Play change.

There will no doubt be changes in the future to ensure the game of bowls survives but they will not be significant if we approach them objectively and with an open mind. Most of us

have lived long enough to realize that change should be embraced and not feared.

Here at Terrigal we already have a close working relationship between the ladies' and men's bowls, and we also share facilities and resources. We are moving on – together!



Committee Meetings and all other face to face meetings are not permitted at the moment. New dates will be communicated when restrictions are eased.

Well, that is all for this late June issue of **Dolphin Tales** and let us all hope that bowls are back to normal before the next issue.


