Chairman's Chat - Looking Ahead

In January, the Board of Directors adopted a Strategic Plan which committed us to taking a formal and business-like approach to future plans for the club. It reiterates our purpose for existence; a vision to secure a future, with amenities and facilities which are pertinent to the times and the expectations of members and guests. A club which attracts new members because we support and promote all levels of the sport of lawn bowls in a welcoming and inclusive club environment.

Our stated mission is -

To secure a future for a profitable club which is a valuable and responsible member of the community.

To facilitate, support, promote and encourage the sport of lawn bowls.

However, a Strategic Plan is nothing more than a road map to help us through the processes to improve the way we do business and improve the facilities and services we provide to members, their guests and visitors.

In February, your Board of Directors met to discuss the considerations for inclusion in a list categorized as 'Renovations, Alterations and Upgrades' which had been compiled from suggestions of members and the personal observations from club management and directors. That list was subsequently reduced with some items grouped into convenient packages and included at the February Board Meeting for endorsement.

As a result, the club has commissioned an architect to provide drawings and we have commenced the task of obtaining costs and estimates, much of which cannot be completed until the drawings are available. Once that is done, we will complete a cost benefit analysis and assess the availability of funds before developing a business plan and sharing it with the members.

Many of you probably think that some items are so long overdue that they should not be subjected to a cost benefit analysis — and your Board of Directors does not disagree. However, we do need to take an holistic long-term view and be very aware of the cost impact on the club. When reviewing the list your Board of Directors is mindful of the need for the club to increase patronage and cash flow if we are to continue the support to our members that we have become accustomed to.

The following projects are included.

- Outside Covered Smokers Area.
- Gaming Machine Area.
- Male Locker Room.
- Board Room create shared facility training room, staff room, room for hire etc.
- Expansion of Barefoot Bowls and Alfresco Dining Areas to transform existing to create a clean, green, and enticing outdoor dining and entertainment area.
- Conversion of Championship Green to Tiffdwarf Grass for season 2023.
- Outside Bar area suitable for corporate groups, alfresco cocktails, pennant bar
- Children's Play Area project estimates to follow completion of project 5.

I'm in the club on most days and happy to answer questions anytime. We will also ensure updates and drawings are placed on the noticeboard and organise an information evening when we have all the information to hand.

Did you know?

A bowl comes to rest and then falls over and touches the jack whilst the next bowl is still in motion. The skip moves forward to mark the fallen bowl as a toucher. The opposing skip objects. Is the bowl a toucher?

No – for the bowl to be a toucher it must touch the jack before the next bowl has been delivered. (Law 14.2)
