### **CHAIRMAN'S CHAT**

Although still affected by events outside of our control and staff absences with COVID, your club management is pleased to report a steady increase in patronage in recent weeks. Raffle and karaoke nights are particularly well attended.

However, for the bowlers the weather has caused cancellations or made for cold, uncomfortable and difficult conditions. The recent improvement in weather conditions is a welcome change. Despite the wet conditions the greens and surrounding gardens are looking pretty good but scheduled cleaning and maintenance to some outside areas has been delayed.

Planned up grades are progressing. The external digital display screen has been replaced and the renovations to the male locker room and multipurpose room are nearing completion. New furniture and fittings for the smokers' area and alfresco dining area have been ordered and those areas will be repainted before their arrival.

The other planned upgrades are at the stage of confirming dates to minimize impact on the club operations.

Inside the club there have been several upgrades which, by-and-large, go unnoticed by members. The gaming machines have been upgraded to a new integrated system and the cash redemption terminal (CRT) has been replaced. Our accounting and payroll

systems have been updated and we have a new membership data base.

I am in the club on most days and I am always happy to answer questions.

Notice of the next AGM (24 September) will be on the notice board by the end of next week. Nominations will be sought to fill all positions on the Board, and I encourage all members who have the time and ability to make a positive contribution to our club.

However, it is not just the Club Limited that is calling for nominations. At this time of year both the Terrigal Women and Terrigal Men Bowling Sections call for nominations to fill positions on their respective committees to manage your bowls. If you want to be part of the team - or you think you can do a better job – now is the time to put your hand up to have a go.
